<u>Scams & frauds</u> Currently there is an increase in reports of people being defrauded or scammed by phone, letter, online and on the doorstep. Double check anyone who contacts you - they may not be who they say they are. Scammers may spend ages getting your trust to con you out of savings and pensions - or may try to try to bully or rush you into making payments urgently.

Trustworthy organisations never rush you, never ask you to transfer money in a hurry, and never ask for your banking details. Please look out for neighbours, friends or relatives who may not realise they are being targeted as victims.
